13 – Field workshop in the region.

14/15 – Heritage and identities.

16 – Research students' presentations.

Students, as in previous years, will be expected to prepare an essay on one of the themes of the seminar, demonstrating a capacity to offer a multidisciplinary reasoning and to frame the discussion within global sustainability concerns. Students delivering an essay and attending the Seminar from the 8th to the 16th March, will be assessed and awarded a certificate. The seminar corresponds to 10 ECTS.
